

ELKS SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

All High School Seniors are eligible to apply for ENF, Most Valuable Student Scholarship. The ENF awards \$2.296 million annually in college scholarships to 500 seniors, nationwide, through the MVS contest. Award amounts range from \$4,000 (\$1,000 per year) to \$60,000 (\$15,000 per year). Deadline for application to be submitted to the Lodge #572 is 10 p.m., Monday, Nov. 2.

The ENF'S LEGACY program (up to 250 four-year \$4,000 Scholarships) is for children and grandchildren of active Elks members who are seniors, going to college, and who exhibit the values of knowledge, Charity, Community and Integrity.
