E. R. MESSAGE

In 1938, November 11th was declared as Armistice Day to celebrate the ending of World War I. It was supposed to be “the war to end all wars.” Unfortunately, it was not. After World War II, Armistice Day was changed to Veterans Day to honor veterans of all wars. The Order of Elks pledged back then that “so as long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them.”

At the end of World War I the Elks financed the creation of two base hospitals in France to care for American soldiers. This was followed with the creation of a state-side hospital to care for returning soldiers. A vocational training program was created to help veterans return to productive lives. These efforts by the Elks were eventually taken over by the federal government and became what we now know as the Veterans Administration and the G.I. Bill. Our pledge to veterans lives on as we honor and support those who serve our country through the Wounded Warrior, Adopt-A-Veteran, Army of Hope, Medals of Valor and other programs. November is Elks Veterans

Remembrance Month.

Here’s an interesting tidbit: General John “Black Jack” Pershing (a member of Elks Lodge #1) was involved in setting up the armistice agreement (the end of fighting) that led to the end of World War I. The agreement was signed on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. Elks recognize the hour of eleven as the hour of remembrance. I haven’t found any evidence that proves his involvement when the agreement was signed, but it does make you wonder....


