Congratulations to the Officers and all members involved in achieving a membership gain of approximately 15-17 for the year! Our membership for 2014-2015 should begin in the range of 616 (It was 273 when we left the Old Lodge Building in the fall of 1996,)! This past year, delinquency was held to only 18, and 8 members passed away. Paired with the low delinquency number was a strong initiation / reinstatement total of 48! Who helped with membership recruitment? Top recruiter was Steve Schemonia, with 7; Merle Evans had 6. Coming in with 3 each were Darcie Hastings, Michael Ryan, and Norm Wayman. (Those with 3 or more will be receiving a Recruiter Pin and Certificate from Grand Lodge.) Great work, everyone - and members all -- let's challenge ourselves to do as well, or better, this new year!

ENF INDIVIDUAL DONATION LEVELS

Elsewhere in this Newsletter, information is given on our year's total donation, and what it means for Lodge #572. However, we should not overlook INDIVIDUAL Donors who are connected to our local Lodge. Here are some individual categories of giving from #572 that most of us are not familiar with, along with the number of donors in each (Individual names cannot be given, due to privacy rights.): Distinguished Member (\$500+) 3; Sustaining Member (\$250+) 1; Participating Member (\$100+) 14 Friend (\$1.00+) 22. (And, as an individual Lodge, #572 and its members have given over \$50,000.00 over its history!) Or, you can write out a check to the Elks National Foundation, and give to Lodge Secretary, who will then forward to the ENF, under your membership number, so that the amount is credited to you, and will then apply to your personal giving history!
