The past month has solidified the upward trend we have been seeing since our full reopening in the summer. The burger sales on Monday nights have steadily increased as the weekly drawings continue to gain popularity. The NFL season also began, which brought with it the return of the Sunday afternoon football crowd. Generous members donate entire meals which are free to all our patrons and their guests, and don't forget to ask the bartender about special deals on the day's worst team when you visit. As many know, the Queen took quite the defeat last month, but I would like to encourage everyone to continue coming to the Lodge on Tuesday night. The food specials are continuing to expand, and new servers are actively being hired to assist those that have been working tirelessly over the last few months.

The back hall rentals have been booking at an incredible rate, and I would like to thank Jerry Willet for his dedication to the proper handling of this business. It has become a much more efficient source of revenue and we have been able to maintain extremely economical prices for our members thanks to his hard work. If you are interested in booking the Lodge any time in the next year, please contact Jerry as soon as possible for the best chance at securing your date of preference.

The flag placement duty that was recently assumed from the Lions club has been met with a terrific response. Steve Schemonia has organized over a dozen members who were able to place flags at numerous businesses throughout Murphysboro to honor Labor Day. They were also able to secure additional posts for businesses which were not able to participate in the past. I think this is an excellent new venture and thank everyone involved in its execution.

I have been very pleased to see the progress of the physical improvements around the Lodge, as well. The new air conditioning system consisting of six mini split units has been fully installed and has operated flawlessly. If you have ever had an issue with the noise of the AC in the back hall, it has been resolved! We were also fortunate enough to have 88 interior lights replaced with much more efficient LEDs, along with the 11 exterior parking lot lights. An Ameren incentive program provided about 98% of the cost of this project, which will save the Lodge a substantial amount of money for many years to come. These improvements and the beginning of new programs has made the Lodge feel much more active and involved, and I look forward to maintaining this momentum through October.

ELKS EMERGING STRONG FROM THE COVID-19 EXPERIENCE!

On September 25, Rick Gathen, Grand Lodge Public Relations and Membership Manager, spoke with Elks in attendance at the IRA Fall Meeting, in Springfield. Some of Rick's observations and comments, relevant to all Elk members, are as follows. Nation-wide, 91% of Elks are paid for 2021 - 2022. This is one of the better figures in recent years, as we enter the month of October! (By the way, at Murphysboro #572, we are currently at 92%.) Nationally, some 50,000 New Members have been initiated since this past April 1 - or stated another way, that is 273 new members per day, so far! (At #572, we have initiated 6, and expect to Orient another 6 or so on Tuesday, Nov. 9, with their Initiation scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 17th, making for a total of 12.) Given the Covid impact and its erratic continuation, why are these numbers so good? Gathen thinks that people recognize what the Elks do for Veterans, the Needy, Children, Homeless, and on and on! That is - we have continued our good works, despite Covid! And, Rick believes that people - inherently attracted to things that make them Happy, have found that meeting with and working with others, at our Elk Lodges, fulfills this need! Much of his discussion stressed that we need to come to our Lodges and Elk Activities / Events; bring guests and friends (potential new members), and enjoy being with, or working with fellow Elks. Gathen likes the concept of, and slogan " Let's Go ELK'in"!! Furthermore, we all need to remember that OUR MEMBERSHIP impacts Veterans, Community, Youth, and Homeless, as just mentioned. Rick had one particular statement that stuck out in my mind: "Future generations depend on the work we do today. Be Active yourself...!" Which should remind us - this is the 121st year of Elks #572 in Murphysboro, Illinois! We have been supporting the Murphysboro Community, doing Elk Charitable Work, and enjoying ourselves (ELK'in) for several generations now - Lets keep it up!
