# **ENF SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION FOR 2022 - 2023**

ELKS LODGE #572

#### **Most Valuable Student (MVS)**

Open to <u>ANY</u> High School Senior who is a U.S. Citizen. Judging Criteria: Academics, Leadership, Financial Need, and Service. 500 4-yr. awards as follows: Two \$50,000; Two \$40,000; Two \$30,000; 14 \$20,000; 480 \$4,000. Applications are now available online at enf.elks.org/MVS and are due online on or before November 14, 2022.

# **Legacy Awards**

Open to Colleg-bound high school seniors who are the <u>children or grandchildren of dues-paying Elks</u>. 350 scholarships at \$4,000 each. Judging based on applicant's commitment to the core values of the ENF: Knowledge, Community Service, Charity, and Integrity. (Legacy scholars are required to serve with the Elks throughout college, to receive their scholarship funds.) Applications are now available online, at enf.elks.org/Leg. <u>Due online on or before February 6, 2023 at 11:59 a.m. Central Time</u>.

### **Emergency Educational Grants**

Provides undergraduate college financial assistance to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks in the form of renewable, one-year grants of up to \$5,000. (This grant is for educational assistance only and is not intended to cover the entire cost of a college education.) Eligibility: attend an accredited U.S. college or university as a full-time (12 semester hours) undergraduate student; demonstrate financial need; be unmarried & under the age of 24 during the academic year for which assistance is desired. Applications available by request between May 1 and November 2 of the academic year for which assistance is desired. # NOTICE TO ALL PAID-UP MEMBERS OF ELKS LODGE #572

As required by Grand Lodge Statutes, we are processing a General Review of our local By-Laws and House Rules. A By-Law Committee was appointed by Exalted Ruler, Richard Martin, and reviewed some 31 items in our current By-Laws where optional changes were possible, along with all House Rules. (The current By-Laws and House rules for Lodge #572 were last approved on January 11, 2015.)

All 31 editable By-Law areas, and all House rules were then reviewed at the Lodge Meeting, held on August 17, 2022. Following discussions, and with some small changes to the committee recommendations, a motion was made, seconded, and passed to present the proposed By-Law and House Rule changes to the membership, via the September, 2022 Newsletter. Notice is hereby given that these changes will be presented for adoption, under Old Business, at the Lodge Meeting on September 21, 2022. Any further changes would have to be made, and passed by majority vote, at this meeting. Or, the proposed By-Laws and House Rules can be adopted in total, as they were presented at the August 17, 2022 Lodge Meeting. The adopted version of By-Laws and House Rules will then by sent to the Grand Lodge Judiciary Committee, and will not go into effect until approved by this committee.

As required by Statute, here are changes presented for adoption: (Changed wording is in **BOLD** print.)

### BY-LAWS:

Article III, Section 1. The Lodge, by affirmative secret ballot of two-thirds of those present at a regular Lodge meeting, may elect a Member in good standing to Life Membership upon the <u>payment in advance of</u> \$2,000.00. (Current amount is \$1,200.00)

(Special Note: Regarding being voted for Life Membership for <u>completion of 40 years</u> of prior membership: No change of the 40 years here at #572, but Grand Lodge at Atlanta, in July, 2022, voted to disallow any age requirement, so the old 70-years of age is no longer required at #572. After the 40th year is <u>completed</u>, dues would be reduced to Grand Lodge and State per-capita, plus \$9.00 administrative fee to Lodge #572.) Do not confuse this with <u>buying</u> a Life Membership, as outlined above.)

Article IV, Section 1. The regular Lodge meetings of this Lodge shall be held **on the third Wednesday of each month throughout the year.** ... In February, March and April, the Lodge will meet on the first <u>and</u> third Wednesday of each month. (Currently, third Wednesday meetings only, are in the months of July, August, and December. <u>Grand Lodge</u> requires 2 meetings in February, March and April.)

#### **HOUSE RULES:**

- 5. (Current): Visitors who are non-Elks have no extended privileges unless accompanied by a member Elk. That member is responsible for the good conduct of their guest(s). (Proposed change to sentence 1): Non-members are allowed in Club Room, only while accompanied by a member in good standing. (No change to sentence 2)
- 7. (Current): Regular employees of the Lodge shall be under the supervision of the Club Manager, House Committee Chairperson, or his or her designee, and shall not be instructed in their duties by any other member of the Lodge. (Proposed change): Regular employees of the Lodge shall be under the supervision of the Club Manager, House Committee Chairperson, **their** designee, **or highest ranking Lodge Officer present at the time**, and shall not be instructed in their duties by any other member of the Lodge.
- 11. (Proposed, New House Rule): Political debates shall not be allowed in the Club Room, as per Elk Member Obligation.
